## Nurses Notes:

Here are some reminders about medications and illnesses.

Keep your child home from school if he or she has a fever, vomiting, or diarrhea. Students must be free of fever, vomiting, or diarrhea for 24 hours before returning to school.

All medications both prescription and non-prescription (such as Tylenol, Advil, cough syrup, or cough drops) require a medication authorization form. If you need a medication authorization form please notify the school and I will send one home. Please remember that all medications both prescription and non-prescription need to be in the original bottle with dispensing instructions attached.

Head lice are common in school aged children and can result in missing school. Here are some ways to prevent and check for head lice at home.

-Do not share brushes, combs, or hats that belong to other people.

-Itching is the most common sign of head lice. The best way to check for head lice is to look for nits (eggs) or live lice at the back of the head and around the ears using a fine-tooth comb. If nits are found within ¼ inch from the scalp it usually indicates an active infestation.

-All lice must be removed before the child can return to school.

*Research has shown that starting the day with a nutritious breakfast helps students stay alert and perform better in school.
